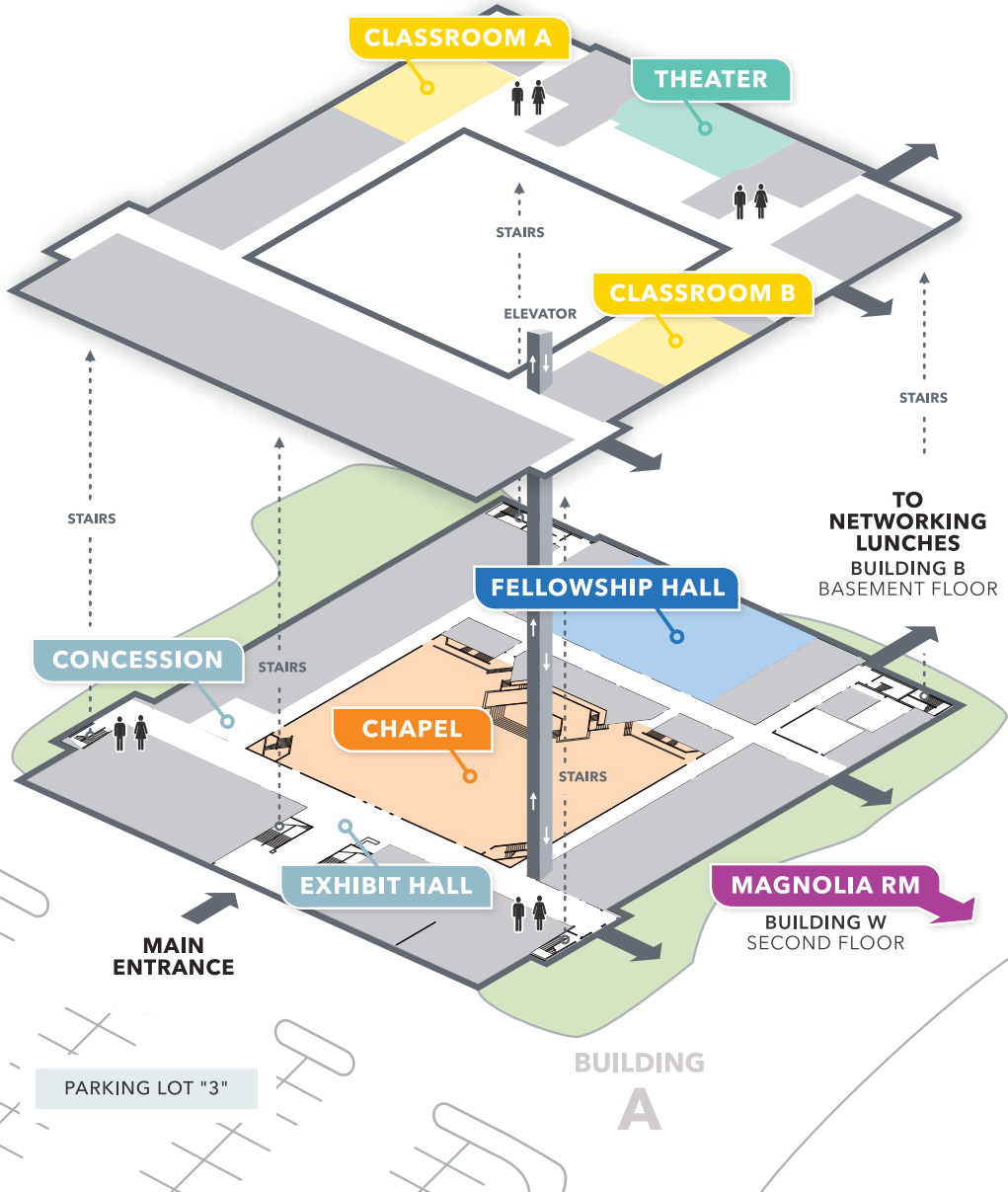

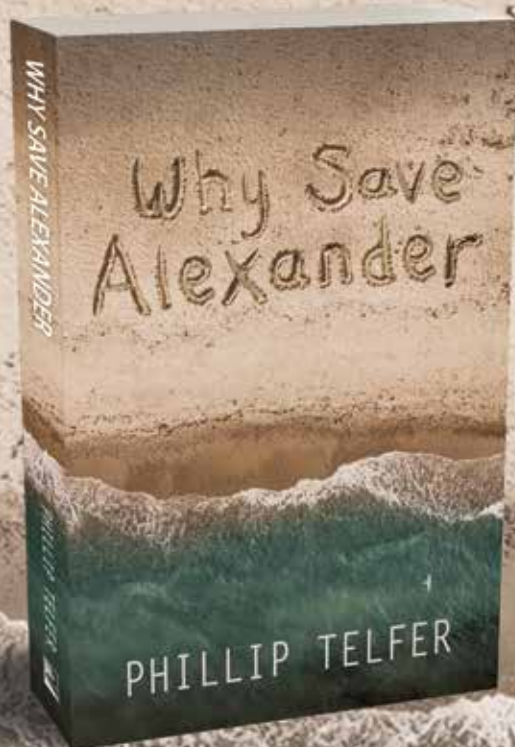

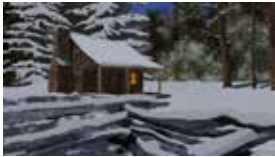

While working with JESUS Film Project in 2003, Doug co-founded the Global Short Film Network, a short film distribution platform and film training program that is used around the world.
